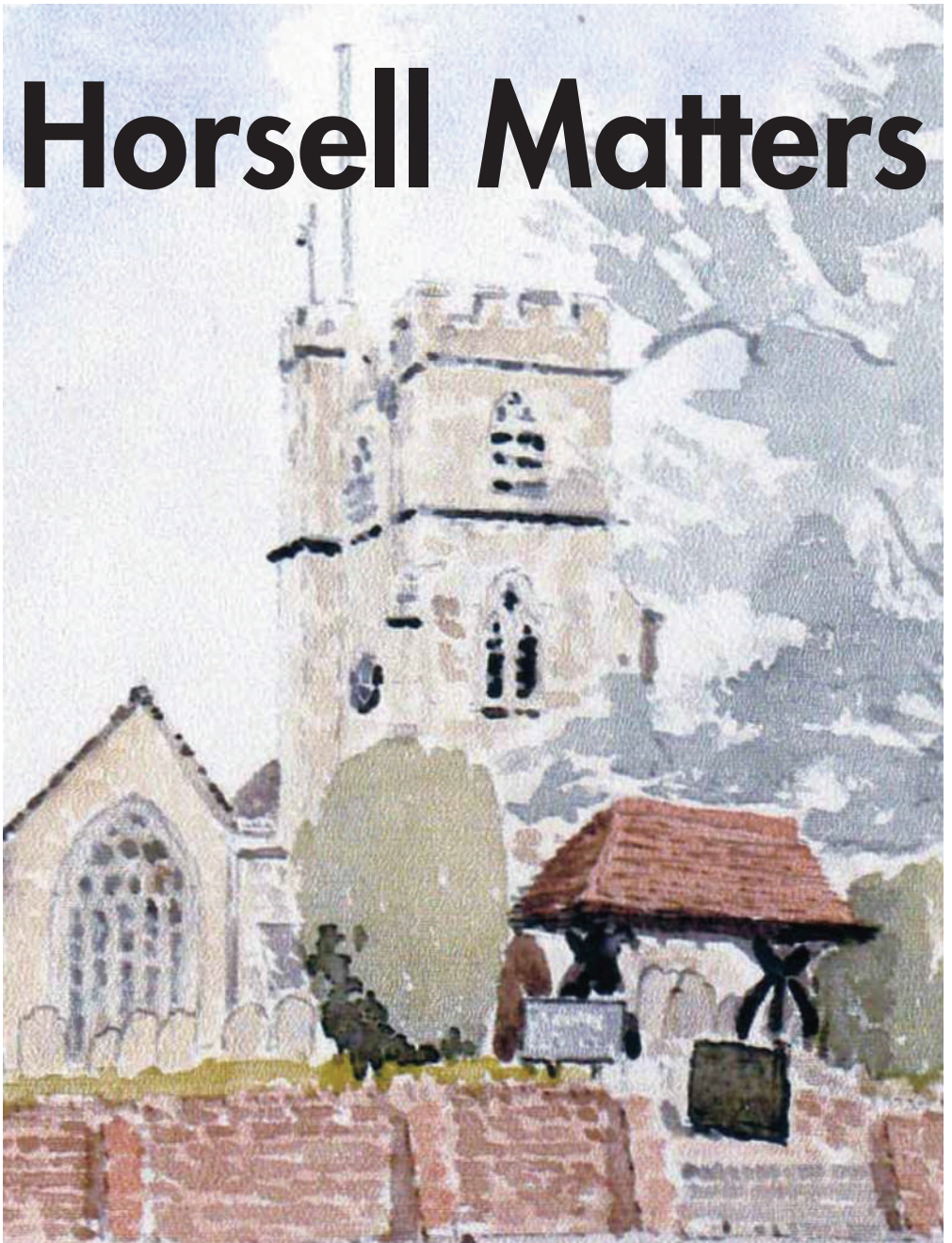

# Getting real



On my daily walks around Horsell, some three miles or so every morning to wake me up and keep me fit, I meet lots of people. I passed one lady this week: ‘How are you,’ I asked and, as is so often the case, the response comes back, ‘I’m fine, thank you Vicar’. But she didn’t look fine to me: she looked harassed and anxious and clearly something was worrying her.

I carried on down the road and met a rather sad looking man. He too told me he was fine. But I knew he wasn’t – not really, not deep down.

It’s quite rare for us to give an honest answer to a cheery ‘How are you’, isn’t it? Somehow we are not quite sure that people expect us to be honest with them. What will they think if we tell them how we really feel? What will they say if we tell them that we got out of bed on the wrong side this morning, kicked the cat, shouted at the cold caller on the phone and feel distinctly off-colour; or troubled by our health; or finances; or the security of our job; or just overwhelmed by the pressure of work; or downright lonely; or gripped by the dark dog of depression and despair. Will they be embarrassed? Will they have anything constructive to say? Dare we get real with people and tell them how things actually are?

One person we can always be very real with though is God. He longs for us to tell him what is really on our hearts. Our Lent studies this year at St. Mary’s are in the psalms and one person who got very real with God was the psalmist. His prayers are full of realism, telling God exactly how it is and exactly what he feels. In psalm 13 for instance the psalmist says ‘*How long must I bear pain in my soul, and have sorrow in my heart all day long?*’ And when the psalmist feels let down and abandoned by God he tells him so: ‘*My tears have been my food day and night, while people say to me continually, “Where is your God?”*’ (psalm 42).

The psalmist’s feelings range through so many real life situations. He brings his joy and happiness to God in thanksgiving. And he brings his darkest hours to God in lament calling out for help and for things to change and asking for strength and courage in the meantime. And yet throughout the psalms there is an amazing consciousness of who God is as the psalmist works through his prayer and comes to trust in God come what may.

So can I encourage you this Lent not to say ‘I’m fine’ to God. Tell him how it really is. And why not use the psalms as your prayers too.

# Springtime in Pembrokeshire

*Lambing on a farm in Wales is very far removed from a comfortable and leisurely life in Woking. Helping with the lambing is, however, one Horsell resident's very unusual hobby. Sarah Hayes recently asked Gill Walsh from Church Close how she got involved in her annual working holiday on the farm . . .*

**M**y first encounter with "real" lambing was some years ago at Easter whilst staying at a farm cottage in Pembrokeshire. It adjoined the lambing barn and, wearing a dressing gown and wellies, I used to help out early each morning making sure that the ewes and lambs had clean water and fresh hay.

My family were always inquisitive to see how many new arrivals had been

born during the night! It was so amazing to see how quickly the lambs were up on their wobbly little legs and following their mothers around – they become agile very quickly and after a day or so can often be found standing on their mother's back getting a better view of their new world.

It is especially fascinating to watch the farmer help a bereaved ewe "adopt" a lamb which needs a new mother

because its own mother doesn't have enough milk or because of fierce competition from too many siblings in the case of twins or triplets.

After many years of staying on the farm and helping in various ways I jumped at the opportunity to be an "extra pair of hands" during the peak week of lambing where the expectant ewes now number around 3,000.

These days farmers know exactly when lambing will begin and, with accurate scanning, even how many lambs each

ewe is expecting. Each ewe is sprayed with a different coloured dot to indicate whether she expects a single lamb, twins or triplets. This is a very useful guide for all those helping.

Each year, attired in wellies, waterproof over trousers and an old warm jumper (and with my sandwiches in an old rucksack!), I arrive to "lend a hand"! My first job is to make tea and coffee for the day time shepherding team as they have been up and working since 5.30am. No delicate suburban trays here so I use an old garden trug to deliver the drinks which always raises a smile with the tired team.

The next job is to help fill up water and hay in around 100 cubicles filled to

bursting with mothers and their new lambs. Nowadays every lamb also has to be weighed and tagged at birth because each sheep has its own personal computerised passport. Everything is computerised these days, even in the lambing barn!

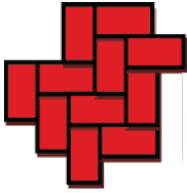
After 24 hours the lambs are released

into the fields. Ewes and their lambs are painted with identical numbers to help in reuniting them in case they get separated in the field. If a lamb does not feed very regularly it can become cold and dehydrated

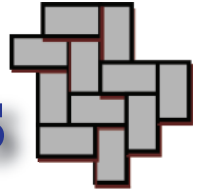


ted and quickly dies.

The lambing barn is a hugely busy place. Sheep in difficulty need "help and intervention" with delivery; some lambs need encouraging with their first breaths; and orphans need "adopting on". New mothers need "boxing up" to give their lambs the best chance and often "mothers in waiting" think another's new lamb is their own and need fending off. Their mothering instinct can be very strong! Weaker lambs are helped with warm infra-red lamps and, yes, I do get to bottle feed some orphaned individuals. It's a delight too to watch all the playful lambs racing and jumping when there is a spare moment!

The boys have worked incredibly hard to maintain an unbeaten run that dates back to the beginning of Year 5 (some 20+ competitive matches!). They are due to represent Woking

in a South East Regional Tournament later this year as well. Their team captain, Daniel Grainger, has written this account of the recent Surrey County finals match.

On the 31st January we arrived at school at 8 am to start our journey to Whyteleafe Football Club for the county finals. We borrowed a mini-bus from Woking High School and Mr. Burns drove us there. We had qualified for the County Finals by winning the District title back in October.

The Club moved to its present location at Queen Elizabeth Gardens in 1963. The new Clubhouse was completed in time for the 2009 season and is now used all year round: for

bowling in the summer season, April to September, and for social events during the winter.

# Calling in the night: Have you heard the Owls?

Perhaps you've heard one? Early in the night, deep in the night, and close to dawn is when the owls call. If you live within earshot of tall trees you may well hear one. "Too- whooo", is roughly what a male owl cries. "Too-whit", is a female owl's contribution.

They are tawny owls, brown birds about the size of a wood pigeon, with those wonderful owl faces, a ring of dark feathers surrounding their dark eyes. (Barn owls are the white and grey ones, with a screeching call.)

Not that you'll see them very often though but you might just spot one if you are lucky: perhaps perched at dusk or gliding on silent wings through the darkness.

In daytime tawny owls prefer to roost inconspicuously up against the trunk of a tree or screened by ivy, or, during their breeding season in a nest in a hollow tree or in one originally built high up by crows.

Tawny owls are widespread in England, Wales and most of Scotland, and are certainly in Horsell.

These classic 'wise old owls' don't in fact live to be very old. Four years is their average age at death. And they certainly aren't cuddly. These birds of prey have efficient beaks and claws, which they use to kill small rodents, small birds, frogs, insects, worms, and even fish.

But they are exciting, mysterious creatures, and hearing tawny owls at night is something to remember, so listen out.

# Sixty Second Interview with Mike Couper

*Sarah Hayes recently caught up with Mike Couper, one of the two Churchwardens at St Mary's, and asked him for a sixty second interview, which was all Mike could manage as he is a very busy man!*

## **Tell me, Mike, how long you have lived in Horsell?**

My wife Gill and I moved here forty three years ago, in 1974. We bought one of the brand new single storey houses in Pine Close which had just been built and it cost us a hefty £9,200. That was a real stretch for us in those days on my teacher's salary. I still live in Pine Close today, but the houses cost rather more!

## **I know that you were a teacher but now that you are retired how is it that you still spend a lot of time visiting the Horsell schools?**

Yes I was one of the very few male primary school teachers for thirty eight years. Although I am retired I just love spending time in our local schools and helping out where I can. One of the great highlights of my week is to dramatise bible stories in our local schools as part of the St. Mary's Open the Book Team. I often end up looking rather outlandish – I was playing the hairy Esau in this picture! As I am quite musical I also help run the Friday lunchtime handbells club at the Junior School and help with their choir when needed.



## **I think you also have a great interest in family history. Can you tell me a little about that?**

I caught the bug for investigating my family history from my late wife Gill. She was able to trace her family tree back to 1538 when King Henry VIII was on the throne. So far my researches into my family only take me back to 1702, so I have a little way to go yet. I love spending my annual holidays in Scotland finding out more.

## **I think you are also involved as a volunteer at the Surrey History Centre?**

Yes, I spend every Tuesday morning as a volunteer at the History Centre. It's a wonderful oasis of peace and quiet. I am having a fascinating time at present indexing hospital admission entries in the early 1840s. It's amazing to see how many people were admitted with some very nasty diseases like typhoid and scarlet fever. And I have found out that the cure for old age admissions was a tonic. I think I need to take one of those!

## **We often see you with a delicious cake in hand serving teas at the Village Fete or refreshments at one of the many St. Mary's events with food. Tell me, do you like cooking?**

Oh yes I love cooking. I wasn't allowed in the kitchen when my wife was alive. That was her very well organised empire. But nowadays I love messing about in the kitchen and I always find it quite magical that I can mix all those ingredients together and a delicious cake pops out of the oven. Mary Berry is my goddess.

## **So what is your favourite food?**

It has to be cake. I love making rich, chocolate cakes, apple cakes and my vicar is very fond of my frangipane tart. She always wants a piece.



## **So what is your favourite hobby?**

I love listening to music, especially live music. One of the great things about living in Horsell is that I can be up on the South Bank within the hour. I really enjoy the Philharmonia and the Orchestra of the Age of Enlightenment Concerts, especially on a Sunday afternoon.

## **So Mike can you tell me one unusual thing about yourself?**

I haven't had a passport for over forty years. I love holidaying in Scotland and don't feel the need to go abroad. I was a bit worried though with the Scottish independence vote that I might need to apply for one.

## The Changing Face of Horsell

Have you spotted the large, empty space at the corner of Kettlewell Hill and Kettlewell Close? Horsell Lodge is no more!

If you have been passing in recent weeks you will have seen, and indeed heard, the bulldozers at work very rapidly demolishing Horsell Lodge, a late 19th century Victorian building with its various later extensions. Until recently this housed the forty bedroom dementia friendly, Horsell Lodge Residential Care Home.



Horsell Lodge has been a care home since the 1940s and the redeveloped site is going to continue that tradition. Very soon you will see a brand new care home going up, but this one will be much bigger than before with seventy sole occupancy bedrooms on site. We also understand that being purpose built it will be a lot more convenient for its new residents and have many more facilities for their care and wellbeing.

Until Horsell Lodge shut St. Mary's Church used to take a monthly service for the residents and staff. These residents have now moved to other residential homes in the locality and St. Mary's wish each of them every blessing in their new homes. Our thoughts are also with all the staff who have moved on to new jobs as well.

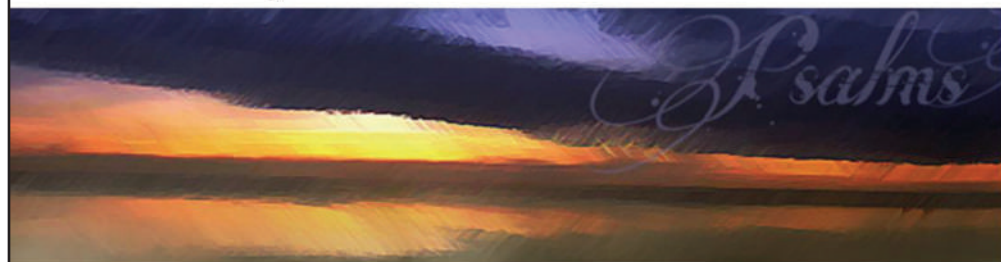

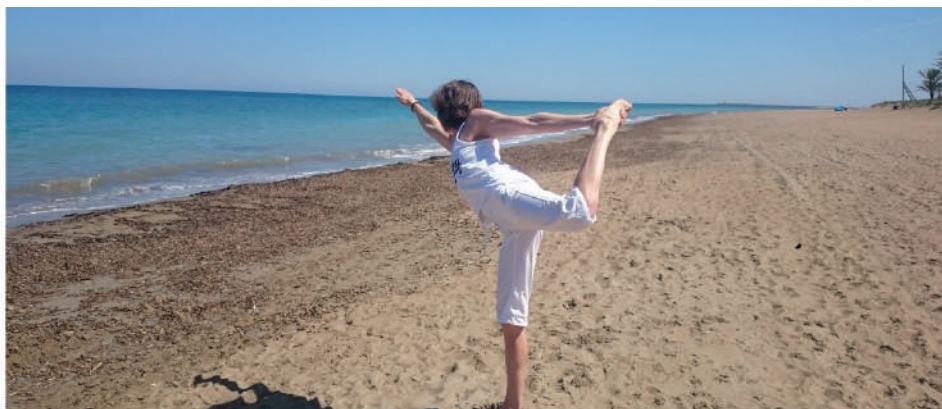

# Sticky Toffee cake

Several years ago I produced a recipe for Sticky Toffee pudding, which became a favourite with many families in Horsell. I am hoping this variation will be equally popular.

## Ingredients for the cake:

125 g (4oz) softened butter, plus extra for greasing  
250g (9oz) self-raising flour, plus extra to dust  
200g (7oz) stoneless dates, finely chopped  
250 ml (9fl oz) freshly brewed hot tea  
200g (7oz) light brown muscovado sugar  
2 tablespoons of golden syrup  
3 medium sized fresh eggs  
1 teaspoon of bicarbonate of soda



## Ingredients for the icing:

100 ml (3 ½ fl oz) double cream  
75g (3oz) light brown muscovado sugar  
25g (1oz) butter  
1 tablespoon of golden syrup

Preheat the oven to 180° C mark 4. Grease a deep round 20.5 cm (8in) cake tin and dust with flour, shaking out any excess. Put the dates in a bowl, pour over the hot tea and soak them for 10 minutes. Put the butter and sugar into a large bowl and beat together with an electric whisk until light and fluffy, for about 5 minutes. Whisk in the golden syrup, followed by the eggs, bicarbonate of soda, flour and date mix. The mixture may look slightly curdled at this point but do not worry. Pour the mixture into your prepared cake tin and bake for 55 minutes or until a skewer inserted into the middle of the cake comes out clean. Leave in the tin until completely cold.

To make the icing put all the ingredients into a saucepan. Heat gently until melted, stir until smooth, then turn up the heat and simmer gently for approx 7 minutes until thickened. Pour into a bowl and cover with parchment paper to prevent a skin forming. Remove the cooled cake from the tin and transfer to a clean cake stand. Spread icing over the top of the cake allowing some to slide over the sides. If the family allows it will keep fresh in an airtight tin for up to 5 days!

# Blast off at the Junior School



On Thursday 1st February, Mullard Space Science Station Laboratory came to Horsell Church of England Junior School and taught us about forces. The scientists at this laboratory are part of University College London and have participated in more than 35 satellite missions and over 200 rocket experiments. They told us all about how rockets launch and fly.

Later on in the afternoon the whole of Year 5 went outside to watch rockets fly up into the air and to see which rocket went the highest. There were three rockets, one for each year 5 class. In Cedar Class, Mr. Whitfield chose two children, Mason and Amber, to go up to the rocket and press the button that would launch it into the air. We all started to count down from ten to one. Then they pressed the button and the rocket blasted off and went whizzing up into the air and made a screeching sound.

As the rocket came down its parachute opened and the rocket floated gently down, finally landing on the school roof. It was a great experiment to be involved in.

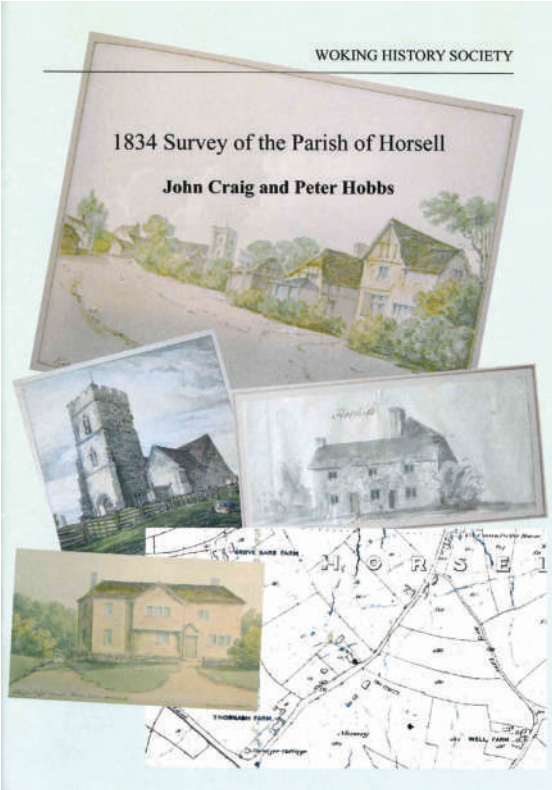


# New light on the old village

When Horsell was an almost entirely agricultural area, with only a handful of residents not employed on the land, and the sites of most of our houses were fields, an anonymous someone carried out a parish survey. This review of land use

in 1834 is unique: the original handwritten document lay with other records at St. Mary's church until it was put into the care of the Surrey County archive 40 years ago.

Now the local historian John Craig and his co-author Peter Hobbs have analysed the 1834 survey, added more information about Horsell in the years immediately before the railway opened up West Surrey, and embellished their work with contemporary illustrations. The result is a most interesting and scholarly piece of local history, published by Woking History Society. It is on sale at Costcutter, in the High Street, price £6.00.
