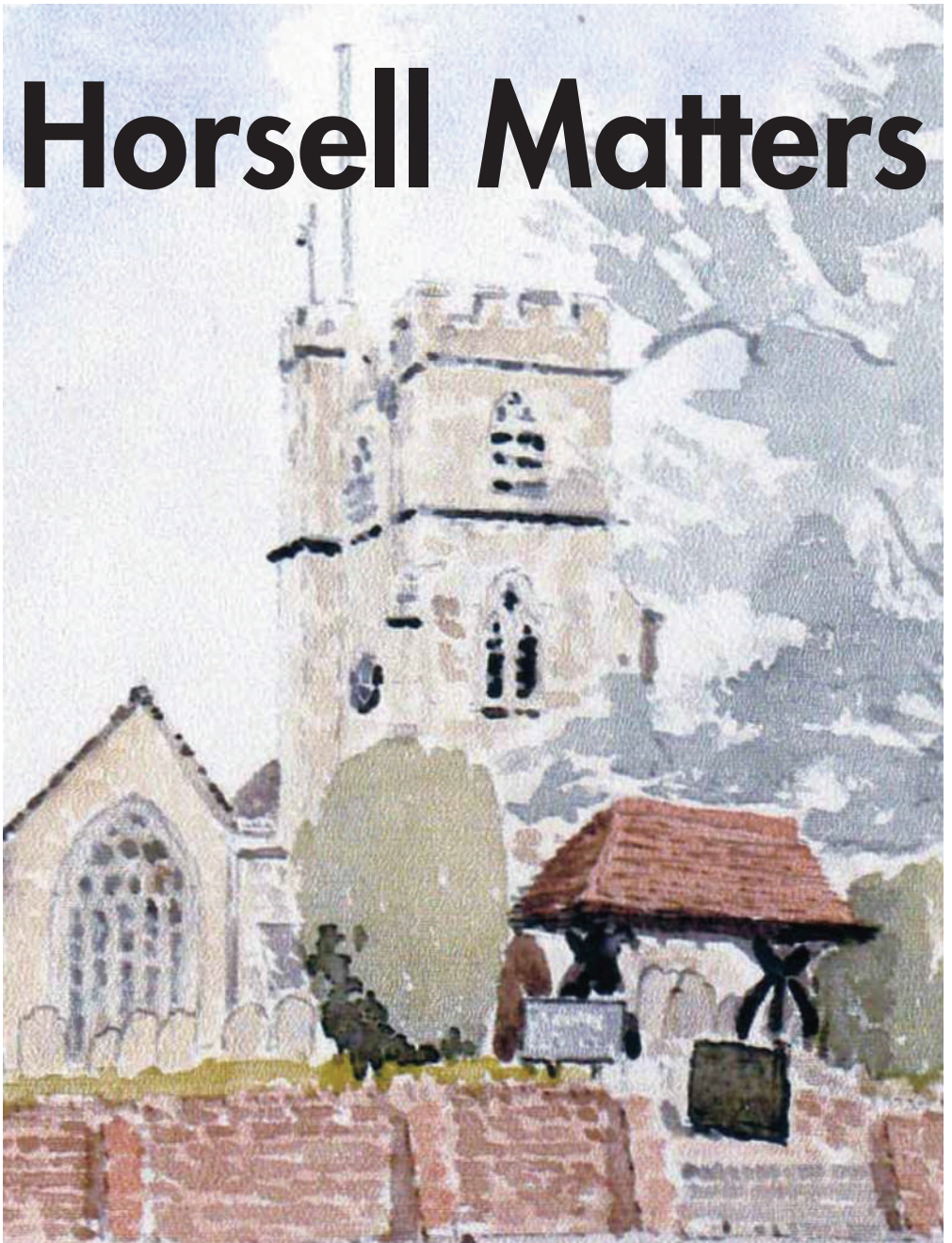

The combination of intellectual research to be historically correct and concentration to make things so small is amazing.

There is a huge sense of achievement as it all gradually comes together.

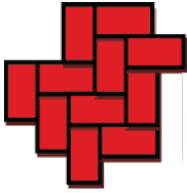

Horsell Care is looking for volunteers.

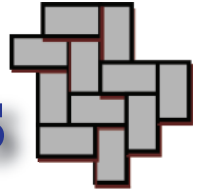

# Three memorials – and one to come

We, like most other communities in the United Kingdom, have a local war memorial, on which the names of most of the local people who died in WWI and the Second World War are listed. You can read all about its history, past and present, in the Autumn edition of *The Resident*.

Some years after the Second World War, Molly Brett, the illustrator and watercolourist who lived in Horsell Vale, made a list of the names on the war memorial on paper, decorating it with drawings of Horsell landmarks. This hangs in St. Mary's church. You can visit and have a look.

Next year, it's hoped, there will be a further memorial in St. Mary's, in the form of a book. This will list the names of all the men and women that are publicly remembered each Remembrance Sunday. These include several people with real links with Horsell whose names, for a variety of reasons, aren't on the war memorial. It will also record information about their links with Horsell and peacetime occupations, their war service, and where they are buried. Where possible there will be a photograph of them as well.

The start of this project was announced in Horsell Matters seven years ago but its completion has been delayed by the wealth of information the researchers found. We hope that it will be completed and in church by midsummer 2019, in time for the centenary of the Peace Treaty that formally ended WWI.

Horsell is unusual, though by no means unique, in also commemorating those who returned from the war. Four wooden boards carry the names of 168 men and one woman. (There were more survivors, but some people did not wish to be included, when they were invited to be on the list in 1920.) These boards were designed for little St Andrew's Church, off Russell Road. When this was shut in the 1980s, and St Andrew's Room was added to St. Mary's, the boards were moved there, where they are now on display.

# Cheerful colour in the winter trees

Commonly seen at bird feeders and in trees along the footpaths all year, compact and pretty adult blue tits are easy to spot. In winter these little birds often join together in small flocks, bouncing, as it were, from tree to tree like feathered ping pong balls. The tops of their heads, their wings, their tail feathers are truly blue, the colour becoming brighter as spring approaches. Their breasts and underparts are yellow, and their faces distinguished by their little black masks.

Other tits may be in the same flocks, and at the same feeders, and sometimes it's hard to tell one kind from another, especially on a dull day. Coal tits are even smaller than blue tits, their underparts are buff, rather than yellow; their wings and back grey, and they have distinctive white feathers at the back of their necks. While blue tits often browse at a source of food, coal tits tend to dart in, pick out a morsel and take it off to a perch elsewhere.

The largest of the tits usually to be seen around Horsell is the great tit. They are appreciably bigger than blues or coals, with handsome plumage – white cheeks, yellow breast, black head, and a black stripe from chin to tail (if it's a male great tit), not so far if it's a female one.

Tits talk a lot. Their songs and calls are varied, great tits being the most versatile. There doesn't appear to be a name for a group of tits. 'A twitter' would be appropriate.

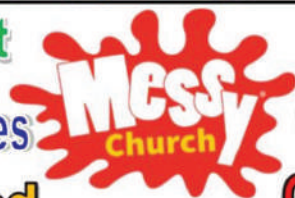

# Parish in the Past

In November 1928, Norman Pares, the Vicar of Horsell, wrote about the new little church building that was planned for the site where part of Heather Close now stands. (Ninety years ago semi-skilled workers earned on average £136 a year, and skilled workers £182.)

Contributions to the amount of £6 12s 6d have been received from 34 persons living in Russell Road towards the cost of the Church, which it is proposed to build there. I would draw attention not to the amount, though I am surprised at its generosity, considering that it is drawn entirely from the pockets of weekly wage-earners, but to the number of contributors, and for this reason, that it is the best evidence that can be given that there are many who welcome and are ready to support the effort according to their means. An additional sum of £3 16s 3d has been given by eighteen persons, living almost entirely in the neighbourhood of Russell Road. I would earnestly appeal to persons of good-will who have the means to do so, to help those who have shown that they deserve to be helped.

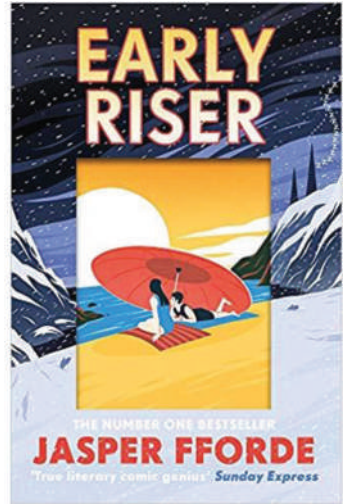

# Christmas book ideas:

## Early Riser by Jasper Fforde



This book shows Jasper Fforde back to his Thursday Next best after the unsettling and ultimately unsatisfactory *Shades of Grey*. The book is set in a Wales which on the surface is like our own. The differences multiply as the story progresses. In Fforde's Wales the ice age never ended. Humans have evolved to hibernate, which they do in dormitoria, with only a select few remaining awake to guard the sleeping. The story follows the exploits of Charlie Worthington, who becomes a Winter Consul almost by accident, as he copes with winter for the first time (having been asleep for all the others) and as he comes up against the Hiber Tech Corporation, the makers of morphenox which induces a dreamless, and supposedly healthier, hibernation. In the way of all drugs morphenox has side effects which result in one in three thousand waking from hibernation physically sound but having lost all higher mental functions.

The book is in places very funny, as with the Mrs Nesbit chain of teashops or the Gronk with its passion for folding linen or the "get fat quick" diets.

The story works at a number of levels. On the surface it is a fast-paced tale of the adventures of our not especially heroic hero while stranded in Merthyr for the winter. It is also about the dangers of unrestricted corporate greed. Charlie is essentially good but the choices with which he is faced are shot through with moral ambiguity as he tries to do the right thing. Who can he trust? Which side are his colleagues in the winter consulate, and in particular his boss the mysterious Toccata/Aurora, really on? Are nightwalkers really brain dead and so useable without qualm as unpaid manual labour and a source of spare parts? Who are the Villains?

It was a slightly surreal read during our long hot summer but the outside temperature ceased to matter after a few pages as the picture of Charlie and his world developed. This book is certainly one which I will re-read before too long.

# Lethal White

## by Robert Galbraith

Cormoran Strike will be a familiar name to those who watched the BBC dramatisation of Robert Galbraith's first three novels. Strike is a war veteran who lost half his leg in Afghanistan. He was in the Special Investigations Bureau and upon leaving the military he set himself up as a private investigator.

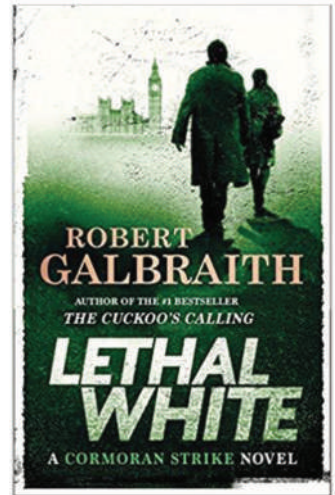
Strike's business partner is Robin Ellacot. When we first meet Robin she is engaged to Matthew. By the end of book 3 she's married him and no longer works for Strike.

Galbraith is a pen name used by J K Rowling and the fourth book in the series is *Lethal White*. The book begins on Robin's wedding day when she discovers her husband has deleted messages and phone calls from her old boss without telling her. Matt had never approved of her job with Strike. Robin wonders if, notwithstanding having been with her new husband for ten years, she really knows the man she's just married. There remains an unspoken chemistry between Strike and Robin.

The plot behind *Lethal White* is taken up a year later, when a Government Minister who is being blackmailed hires Strike. Embezzlement is discovered and then Strike's client dies, allegedly having committed suicide. Hired by the family to investigate further, Strike and Robin discover the truth behind his death. Meanwhile, both Strike and Robin struggle with their intimate relationships.

*Lethal White* has a disturbing ending not least because the reader is so fully engaged by Galbraith's characterisation of the two protagonists.

A long and easy to read novel; each chapter's close invites you to read on. Highly recommended to Galbraith/Rowling (adult/young adult) fans. Be aware however, it does include some bad language but it is not gratuitous and is in keeping with the particular characters being portrayed. Read the novel rather than wait for the inevitable TV dramatisation.

# Mushroom Strudel

## Ingredients

1 tablespoon of vegetable oil

50g unsalted butter, melted

300 g chestnut mushrooms or 100 g wild mushrooms if available plus 200 g chestnut

2 shallots, finely chopped

1 garlic clove finely chopped

8 thyme sprigs, leaves picked

3 tablespoons of port or red wine

1 heaped tablespoon of mascarpone

25g chives, chopped

270g pack filo pastry

30g parmigiano reggiano, grated



Heat the oil and 1 tablespoon of melted butter in a large frying pan. Add the mushrooms and cook over a high heat for 4-5 minutes until soft and starting to colour. Add the shallots, garlic and thyme, cook for 1-2 minutes, then pour in the port or wine. Boil rapidly until syrupy and then stir in the mascarpone and chives. Cool completely.

Meanwhile heat the oven to 200 C, gas mark 6. Layer the filo sheets on a baking tray, brushing each sheet with the remaining butter as you go. (Cover the remaining sheets with a clean damp tea towel as you work to avoid drying out). Spread the cooled filling over the pastry leaving a 3cm border all round. Sprinkle the cheese on top of the filling. Fold the short ends over, then roll the whole thing so the seam is sealed underneath. Bake for 20 - 25 minutes until golden. Slice & serve immediately. (I serve it with Rocket).

# Pets at Christmas



With Christmas soon appearing on the horizon it is a good time to look at some tips to stop your pet getting into trouble over the Festive period.

First, the Christmas Tree. Any self-respecting cat is going to decide that the tree is a challenge to see if it can be climbed or not and any dangly bauble is there to play with, so it is not really a good idea to leave the tree unattended. If you have dogs then try not to put any edible decorations (especially chocolate) or presents on, or under, the tree, for you will probably find that they will not be there for very long.

Ensure that any cables for tree lights are kept out of the way or covered as most pets will try and chew them, especially house rabbits who just have to chew anything new and different. Also, do vacuum around the tree regularly as real or fake pine needles can be a choking hazard or cause upset tummies.

Keep an eye on any Christmas house plants, many of them are poisonous to cats and dogs.

Christmas can also be stressful for your pets; one tip is to create a little sanctuary for them in another room where they can escape the commotion. Put in there for them food, water, toys and their bed to make them feel safe. Also keep up their regular feeding and walk routines.



Don't feed chicken or turkey bones to your pet, they can splinter and cause serious problems.

Finally, some people think it would be a good idea to buy a small animal as a present for someone. If you want to do this wait until after Christmas as most Pet Retailers will not sell any animals during the run up to Christmas. They will suggest you buy any items you need to look after them such as cage, food, toys etc and may offer a gift card as an alternative to getting an animal.

# Churchyard Cat



I, and many of my fellow cats, are accustomed to coming and going as we please at the houses in which our human staff live, by means of small doors, known as 'cat flaps' that form part of the larger doors that humans have to open before they can move about in the open air.

Some cats are obliged to wear collars that activate the cat flap, so that strangers (or squirrels, foxes or even, heaven forbid, small dogs) cannot get through. Much against my will, I had such a collar once, but I contrived to lose it. It was awkward being stuck inside, or outside, after that, but quite soon I was forcibly carried to my vet's surgery where, so I understand, 'a microchip' was implanted in me, and this now opens my door for me.

However, I now learn that human interference in feline lives has gone even further. One of my acquaintances tells me that her people claim to know whether she is in or out at all times, even when they are away from their home at work, or in holiday. They have, she says, 'an app' on their phones, that enables them to see her using her cat flap.

Personally, I would strongly resent being spied on in this way; having my decisions to spend all day meditating indoors, or all night hunting, monitored, and very possibly discussed on line with the rest of the world. And if I bring moribund voles or almost dead mice indoors, that should, I feel, remain a private matter.
